Subject: Marina Renovation


In January 2016 information was sent to all Lodge members outlining the need to renovate our docks, bulk heads, boardwalks, piers and ramp. At the December 10, 2015 members meeting the following motion was made and passed: "Based on the recommendation from the Dock Committee and a formal report from our contracted Marine Engineers, Waterman LLC, regarding the condition of our boat ramp, bulkheads, docks, piers and boardwalks, a formal bid process was prepared to perform the work. Three sealed bids were received on 11/01/2015. After review of the bids, the Board is requesting approval NTE \$700,000 for this project. The project will span several years and be completed in sections based on condition of the Marina according to the Marine Engineers. These monies will also encompass evaluating and possibly replacing existing water and electrical lines to each boat slip as well as any unanticipated costs. Financing this project will be done in small increments to lessen the burden to the Lodge while recognizing the importance the Marina has toward the overall operation." Motion not to exceed \$700,000 to support this project was made, seconded and passed.

In the spring of 2016 we completed the replacement of our ramp as a first phase of this project. The Marina budget for the Elk Year 2015/16 included the ramp replacement and was paid for through this budget. We would like to proceed with phase two and address the North side of the Marina which has been identified as a priority. The proposal includes ripping out and replacing approximately 200LF of bulkhead. Again, money has been budgeted for this project in the 2016/17 Elk Year Marina budget.

At the February 9, 2017 Members meeting a formal vote will be taken to approve this project as a Lodge. Questions and concerns would be heard at that time. If approved, an application will be made to Grand Lodge seeking their approval to proceed with this project.
